FOOD & DRINK

Here's a quick selection of some decent downtown restaurants hungry festivalgoers might like to consider:

Venezia
Zahrádní 43

Open daily from 11am "till at least 12:00am"

With a garden directly opposite the Thermal, Venezia is the perfect place to take a breather over a cool *Budvar* (35 CZK) and watch some festival wildlife. The Italian cuisine on offer is also perfectly palatable. You can pick up a hearty pasta here or a pizza with generous toppings for around 100-200 CZK. There's also a tasty range of meat dishes such as beef stroganoff and goulash, although these are a little pricier. If you fancy something more ambitious, there's even a special fish menu proffer-

ing such delicacies as turbot, sea bass and bream. Diners in the land-locked Czech Republic might understandably approach any seafood offerings with some trepidation. Nevertheless, with fish dishes costing as much as 850 CZK apiece, one would presume that the chef has sourced his ingredients a little bit further afield than the freezer of the local supermarket.

U zlatého karase

Although most KV hostelrys open a little later during the fest, *U zlatého karase* really pushes the boat out by keeping punters fed and watered until the wee small hours. It's a little bit off the beaten track but well worth the hike. This rough and ready establishment has a typically Czech feel to it (unusually shaped aquariums notwithstanding) and it duly serves up some reasonably priced local fare (90 - 250 CZK). For those on a tight

budget, there's also a very cheap lunch menu, which our friendly barman promised would only be "a little bit more expensive" during the festival.

Sklípek

Open daily from 11am "till as long as it takes"

Like *U zlatého karase*, this subterranean restaurant serves a hearty selection of solid Czech fare. Tasty local standards such as *svíčková na smetaně* (beef sirloin in cream) and *smažený syr* (fried cheese in breadcrumbs) may not do anything for your blood pressure, but they'll certainly fill a hole and are also good value (main courses range from 65 - 230 CZK). Situated at the top of Moskevská Street, Sklípek is at a slight remove from KVIFF central, which makes it the perfect place to take a break over a few cold beers on its outdoor terrace, well away from the festival hordes.
