SYNOPSIS

In August 1983, architect Dinu Neagu together with his wife and two children, a boy and a girl, are on a beach of nudists near an industrial area. After graduating from "lon Neculce" high school, where he studied intensively foreign languages, being a very good German speaker, Alexandru graduated from the Acting Department at U.N.A.T.C. (Romanian Film School) in 2002, graduating in the class of the great professor and actor Dem Rădulescu. He won the Best Actor Award at the Thessaloniki Film Festival for the main role he played in "Stuff and Dough" - directed by Cristi Puiu (2001).

He also had roles in films like: "In Love with Best Intentions" (2011) and "Domestic" (2012) – both directed by Adrian Sitaru, "Happy Funerals" (2013) – directed by Horaţiu Mălăele and "Francesca" (2009) – directed by Bobby Păunescu. (born on May 13th, 1979) graduated from U.N.A.T.C. in 2002.

He worked as operator on Cristi Puiu's "The Death of Mr. Lăzărescu" (2005),

winner of the Un Certain Regard Prize in Cannes Film Festival,

and on "Marilena from P7" (2006) – directed by Cristian Nemescu.

He has collaborated with Radu Jude since 2006:

Co-screenwriter and picture director for "Morning" (2006), followed by the short film "Alexandra" (2006).

ANCA PUIU-PRODUCER

(born on October 30th, 1971) is a well known Romanian film producer. After graduating the "Gh. Asachi" University in Iaşi, she worked as country manager for a company manufacturing sportswear for the Premier League in Britain. Together with her husband, director Cristi Puiu, she founded the Mandragora company, a cinema production house, in 2004. Their first project, "The Death of Mr. Lăzărescu" was widely acclaimed and is considered the film that started the "Romanian New Wave" in cinema. They continued with short and feature films like: "Megatron" (2008) – directed by Marian Crisan, Palme d'Or - Festival de Cannes, "Aurora" (2010) – directed by Cristi Puiu, Festival de Cannes, "Morgen" (2010) – directed by Marian Crisan, Locarno Film Festival, "Viktoria" (2014) – directed by Maya Vitkova, Sundance Festival, "Self-Portrait of a Dutiful Daughter" (2015) – directed by Ana Lungu, IFF Rotterdam, "Sieranevada" (2016) – directed by Cristi Puiu, Festival de Cannes, "One and a Half Prince" (2018) by Ana Lungu, Sarajevo IFF 2018, and many more.



Founded by Anca and Cristi Puiu in 2004, Mandragora is one of the most important production companies in Romania. Their first production, "The Death of Mr. Lăzărescu", was internationally acclaimed, and is considered the film which started the New Wave in Romanian cinema. They continued with short and feature films such as: "Megatron" (Marian Crişan, "Palme d'Or" Cannes 2008), "Aurora" (Cristi Puiu, Cannes 2010), "Morgen" (Marian Crişan, Locarno 2010), "Rocker" (Marian Crişan, IFF San Sebastian 2012), "Viktoria" (Maya Vitkova, IFF Sundance 2014), "Self-Portrait of a Dutiful Daughter" (Ana Lungu, IFF Rotterdam 2015). Among their documentary titles are: "Metrobranding", by Ana Vlad and Adi Voicu, selected in 2010 for several DocAlliance film festivals, "Romanians in Ukraine" and "Romanians in Serbia", by the same team of directors, "Songs for a Museum", a documentary by Eliza Zdru and a coproduction for "One Girl" by Rosa Russo (Astra IFF 2018). Their most recent films are: "Sieranevada" by Cristi Puiu (Festival de Cannes Official Competition 2016) and "One and a Half Prince" by Ana Lungu (Sarajevo Film Festival - Competition Programme 2018), "Arest" by Andrei Cohn, Karlovy Vary IFF 2019, "Cărturan" by Liviu Sandulescu selected in most important festivals in 2019.

Mandragora is currently developing and producing more than ten film projects: features films, including the new project by Cristi Puiu, feature film "Malmkrog", most recent and just finished shooting is the film by Josef Demian "Night Patrol" and developping the new project by Gabriel Achim, "Night", a debut by Sarra Tsorakidis "Ink Wash", new coproduction "Afrika" by Maya Vitkova, documentaries, animations and short films.
