



LOGLINE

SYNOPSIS



Valentine is an eccentric projectionist. For 44 years, he's been working in one of the oldest movie theatres in Kiev's city centre. In his projection booth, he drinks with war veterans, dances with the girls from next door casting agency or cuts his friend's hair. Every day at work seems like another adventure. It all comes to an abrupt end when a fire breaks out in the cinema and Valentine is forced to retire. He looks after his dying mother, rushing to help her the moment she calls. With an average life expectancy for men in Ukraine of 64 years, Valentine is aware that he does not have much time left. Still, he fights desperately to find a new meaning in life in a rapidly changing country.

Yuriy Shylov graduated from the directing department of Kyiv National Karpenko-Kary University of Theatre, Cinema and Television. He has worked with feature and documentary projects. In 2015, he shot the short film Weight, Audience Prize in VGIK International Film Festival and in 2016 the short documentary Panorama. Docudays UA IFF – Student Jury Prize. Kyiv ISFF – Jury's Special Mention, Audience Prize. Odessa IFF – Jury's Special Mention. Gogolfest UA – Best Short Nonfiction Film.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT



I have a lot of retired friends and notice the same problems and crucial points in their lives. Valentyn plays the role of a guide in this tragicomedy. Crowds of people pass by him. Losses, diseases, search for new activities and senses... All these things seem to be familiar to everybody. Valentyn is a swinger. I was curious to see the person with such a temper searching for his own sense when it all was fading, falling and going away.

Olga Beskhmelnytsina



Several of them were presented at IDFA (A Lesson of Belarusian - The Movies Quad DocU Award at IDFA 2006, Music Partisans, Ada's Gallery, When Will This Wind Stop – participation in IDFA Forum 2015 and ARRI Award for the Best Student Documentary in 2016, Alisa in Warland - main award at the 8th FIDADOC, Morocco, 2016; main award in the Breaking Docs section of the IDFF Docs MX, Mexico, 2016.
