On a rainy autumnal day, people show up one after the other — all of them on the verge of a breakdown - or perhaps a breakthrough? The main character, Waitress, sees and absorbs it all. One by one - through their personal drama - the clients push the Waitress towards her own edge.

The End of The Chain tells a story of people in the middle of a crisis - both in their souls and in the world around them. It is a film about the wish to find an anchor in life and the need to feel understood and approved. Deep topics are spiced up with smart and nuanced humor.

The End of The Chain is based on a theatre play by an Estonian Oxford philoshopy, political sciences and economics graduate Paavo Piik and born out of our curiosity for this post-dramatic material carrying a strong statement about the contemporary urban life.

# PRIIT PÄÄSUKE

Priit Pääsuke (b. 1975) graduated from the Tallinn University with BA in film directing in 2005. Currently he is graduating from the MA program of theatre and film directing at the Drama School of Estonian Academy of Music and Theatre. Priit's short fiction Black Peter (2008) premiered at the 38th Tampere Film Festival, participated at 22 film festivals and won 11 prizes; in 2015 he premiered the feature length documentary Impromptu. In May 2017 Priit's theatre directing debut - Riverside Drive by Woody Allen - premiered at a recently opened indie-theatre Kelm in Tallinn. The End of The Chain is Priit's fiction feature debut.

Paavo Piik (b. 1983) is an Estonian poet, theatre writer and director, active in Tallinn City Theatre and Kinoteater. #### **EUGEN TAMBERG**

Eugen Tamberg (b. 1954) is a well established Estonian production and costume designer, who has worked on numerous film, TV and theatre productions such as Names in Marble by Elmo Nüganen (2002) and Purge by Antti Jokinen (2012). Eugen Tamberg created the main location of The End of The Chain - the burger joint - from scratch into an empty glass interior.

# PRODUCTION COMPANY

Alexandra Film is established and ran by creative producer Marianne Ostrat and produces short, feature and documentary films with compelling and human stories, that aim to touch, shake and inspire the audiences around the world. In 2009 Alexandra Film released a medium-length drama **Strays** by Sutharsan Bala, that received four special mentions at it's first three festivals (The Norwegian Short Film Festival, Nordisk Panorama New Nordic Voices, Sleepwalkers Student and Short Film Festival) and was altogether selected to 14 international film festivals. In 2017 Alexandra Film will release it's first feature, The End of The Chain by Priit Pääsuke and a short fiction Helen's **Birthday** by Tanno Mee (world sales: Premium Films). In addition, Alexandra Film co-produces a feature documentary Constructing Albert by Laura Collado and Jim Loomis from Barcelona-based Trueday Films (world sales: Wide House), also to be released in 2017.
